Refuse & Recycling Guide

In 1990, Wisconsin enacted a recycling law to help landfills last longer and to encourage reduction, reuse, and recycling of Wisconsin's solid waste. This recycling law bans many materials from Wisconsin's landfills, with the intent that such materials will instead be reused, recycled, or composted. This Recycling Guidebook contains helpful information relating to your refuse and recycling needs both in the Village and Town of Weston.

What to RECYCLE

in your single-stream recycling cart

"Single-stream recycling" means putting ALL recyclable materials in one, single cart.



2 OPTIONS IF YOUR RECYCLABLES DO NOT ALL FIT IN YOUR CART

1. Take your excess recyclables to Waste Management public Recycling Drop-Off Center (5509 Fuller St.) during the following times:

- **Monday – Friday:** 8:00 a.m. – 4:00 p.m.
- **First Saturday of each month:** 8:00 a.m. – noon

To ensure the recycling being dropped off is coming only from eligible Village & Town of Weston residents and taxpayers, **there is a check-in process.** Just visit Waste Management’s front office, and a staff member will direct you into the Recycling Drop-Off Center.

2. Take your excess recyclables to Marathon County Solid Waste Department (172900 State Highway 29). They will accept recyclables from any residence or business in Marathon County, though a small fee may apply.

- **Monday – Friday:** 7:00 a.m. – 3:30 p.m.
- **Saturdays** (March – November): 8:00 – 11:30 a.m.

PLEASE TAKE NOTE!

1. DON'T flatten your recyclables (*except boxes*).
2. Black plastics (*like frozen food trays*) are **NOT** recyclable.
3. Clamshell plastic containers (*like those that hold berries*) are **NOT** recyclable in Weston.
4. Spray cans, whether containing non-hazardous or hazardous material are **NOT** recyclable in Weston.

WHEN TO CALL WASTE MANAGEMENT

- If your refuse or recycling cart is broken, missing, or not emptied
- If you'd like to change the size of your refuse cart (*only one size is available for recycling carts*)
- If you need to arrange for a special pick-up for large items (*fees will apply*)

Waste Management can be reached at 715-359-6637 Monday–Friday from 8:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m.

IS YOUR CART IN DISREPAIR?

If either your refuse cart or recycling cart is damaged (cracked, missing its lid, missing wheels, etc.), all you need to do is contact Waste Management at 715-359-6637 and let them know your cart is in disrepair. Depending on the type of damage, they will either repair or replace your cart for FREE!



Please be aware that **ONLY RECYCLABLES** are allowed in your 95-gallon recycling cart. If it's found that you have refuse in your recycling cart, Waste Management will not empty it. Similarly, if it's found that you have recyclables in your refuse cart, Waste Management will not empty it.

Please be aware that you can be fined for not properly recycling, as recycling is a State law. If you'd like to read Weston's Solid Waste Ordinance, you can find it online at: www.westonwi.gov/SolidWaste.

What you need to know about a MATERIAL RECOVERY FACILITY

When your recycling cart is emptied into the Waste Management recycling truck, materials are first taken to Waste Management’s transfer station on Fuller Street. Their transfer station is divided into two sections: one is for trash and one is for recycling. The recycling truck will back into the recycling section, where it dumps the load of recyclables onto the floor. Other equipment then loads the recyclables into a semitruck, which then hauls the recycling to the **WM Germantown Material Recovery Facility (MRF)**.



When the semi arrives to the MRF, the materials are dumped onto their tipping floor and then taken to the sorting line, where the materials are rapidly hand- and machine-sorted. Once sorted, materials are baled and shipped to recyclable buyers.

The Director of Portage County Solid Waste, Amanda Haffele, oversees a nearby MRF. Amanda provided us with some helpful information for our residents, such as the following.

DON'T FLATTEN YOUR RECYCLABLES (EXCEPT BOXES)

The only recyclables that should be broken down are boxes. **Plastic bottles, aluminum cans, and tin cans should be left whole** so that the sorting machines can recognize their original shape. A small squeeze of a container isn't going to harm the sorting process. It's when they receive "roadkill flat" recyclables that it causes issues since such items are so flat that they can be mistakenly sorted as though they are paper when going through the sorting process at the MRF, and consequently they mistakenly end up in the paper bales, thus creating contamination.

BLACK PLASTICS (LIKE FROZEN FOOD TRAYS) ARE NOT RECYCLABLE.

Black plastic containers (such as those some frozen foods come in) are NOT recyclable. Black plastics are unreadable with the MRF's optical sorters and therefore — unless they are each pulled out by hand — they are not going to get sorted out as a recyclable material and will simply end up as trash. Black plastic is very undesirable because once it's colored black, whatever it gets shaped into can no longer be recycled.

CLAMSHELL PLASTIC CONTAINERS (LIKE THOSE THAT HOLD BERRIES) ARE NOT RECYCLABLE IN WESTON.

Even though the bottom of the container is labeled #1, which typically is an indicator that a material IS recyclable, PET clamshells are different than their cousin — the PET plastic bottle — because they've been changed on a molecular level. PET plastic bottles CAN be recycled into clamshells, but clamshells CANNOT be recycled into plastic bottles — the process doesn't work that way. (It has to do with how they're heated, molded, and made.) This is why clamshells aren't being recycled and are not desired by buyers. There's a manufacturer in Madison, WI, that makes clamshells, but they require two semitruck loads per year worth of material in order to accept it.

AEROSOL SPRAY CANS (LIKE COOKING SPRAY, PAINTS, CLEANERS, ETC.) ARE NOT RECYCLABLE IN WESTON.

These containers are pressurized and partially full cans can become very dangerous if they get punctured during the sorting process.

If you have some 100% empty aerosol cans, there are some scrap metal dealers out there that may take them. Please know that Yaeger's Auto Salvage does not accept those.

2023 HOLIDAY REFUSE & RECYCLING PICK-UP SCHEDULE

Waste Management will be closed in recognition of the following holidays, which fall on weekdays:

- **Memorial Day**
May 29
- **Independence Day**
July 4
- **Labor Day**
September 4
- **Thanksgiving Day**
November 23
- **Christmas Day**
December 25

On these holidays, refuse and recycling collection for the remainder of that week will occur one day later (i.e., if Waste Management is closed on a Thursday, then Thursday's pick-up will occur on Friday, and Friday's pick-up will occur on Saturday).

CHRISTMAS TREE COLLECTION

Thursdays & Fridays during January

The process for collecting holiday evergreen trees (Christmas Trees) will be a little different this year. During the month of January, trees will be collected on Thursdays and Fridays, and by a separate truck (not the regular garbage truck).

Trees set out for collection need to be:

- Cut in half (4-feet or less in length),
- Out curbside,
- Not have any decorations on them, and
- Not frozen into the snowbanks or covered with ice and snow.

As the regular route drivers are out emptying containers, they will keep track of properties where trees are set out for collection, and will relay that information to the staff who are going around collecting them on Thursdays and Fridays. Because of this, it is still good to have your tree set out on your collection days so that the driver can make note of your address.

If it is getting late into the month of January, and your tree has not been picked up yet, please contact Valerie Parker, at 715-241-2607, or vparker@westonwi.gov. Once January has passed, if you still need to dispose of your tree, you can take it to Marathon County Solid Waste Department (a.k.a. Ringle Landfill), during their office hours. There is a \$10.00 disposal charge for trees.



HOLIDAY LIGHTS

Habitat for Humanity is collecting used or burned-out strands of holiday lights for their recycling program. Lights can be dropped off at any of the following locations:

WRAPPING PAPER

Unless the wrapping paper looks and feels like actual paper, **it most likely is NOT recyclable**; same with gift bags. Wrapping paper that looks like foil actually contains metals and is not recyclable. The "crinkly" wrapping paper is made of a type of cellophane (or other plastic) and is also not recyclable. Following the mad rush of opening gifts, please be careful what you put in your recycling cart this holiday season. Consider saving and reusing wrapping paper for your next gift-giving event. WHAT DO I GET FOR MY REFUSE/ RECYCLING FEE?

Property owners of single-family homes up to 4-unit apartments (on 1 tax parcel) are billed an annual refuse/recycling special charge on their property tax bill. Currently, the annual fee is calculated at \$167.00 per residential unit.

For those properties who are charged this amount, this special charge covers the costs of several benefits available to you:

- Weekly curbside refuse (garbage) collection and every-other-week single-stream recycling collection
- Spring and fall roadside yard waste collection and the open yard waste site (8200 Ryan St.) for yard waste drop-off
- Spring and fall bulk-item drop-off events (May and October), allowing you to drop off your large bulky items — at no additional cost — during the scheduled events
- Weston Recycling Drop-Off Center (for your excess recyclables) at Waste Management (5509 Fuller St.), which is open Monday – Friday (8:00 a.m. – 4:00 p.m.) and the first Saturday of each month (8:00 a.m. – noon)
- Expert resources from Marathon County Solid Waste Department to answer any and all of your refuse or recycling questions through their Recycling Hotline 877-270-2989
- Printed annual Refuse & Recycling Guide (also available at www.westonwi.gov/RefuseRecyclingGuide)

HOSTING A SPECIAL EVENT?

DON'T FORGET ABOUT RECYCLING!

If you're hosting a special event, whether it be a large public event or private event, don't forget to recycle. Everyone has trash containers that get set out; but what about recycling containers? How do you make it obvious to your guests which container is which?

Marathon County Solid Waste Department offers Clear Stream Recycling Containers — FREE for event hosts to borrow!

Along with the container (as pictured), you'll be provided with clear bags to use at your event. All you have to do is call Marathon County Solid Waste at 877-270-2989 in advance of your event to reserve your containers and bags. Simply pick up the containers and drop them back off when finished. It's THAT easy. So be sure to recycle at your next event!



What to do with...

THE FOLLOWING ITEMS

PLASTIC BAGS

Plastic bags should **NOT** be placed in your recycling cart. Not only do they get loose and blow around in the community, but they also get tangled up in the equipment used to manage recyclables. **Please consider recycling your plastic bags by taking them to Weston Pick 'n Save, Target, or Festival Foods',** as they have recycling bins at the front of their stores specifically for collecting plastic bags. Or, consider donating them to places like Goodwill, the Humane Society, or child daycare facilities.



USED COOKING OIL

Marathon County Solid Waste (172900 State HWY 29, Ringle) will accept used cooking oil for recycling. There are also many restaurants that will accept used cooking oil, and some mechanic shops may accept used cooking oil as well, if they do biodiesel fuel. If you need to dispose of the cooking oil in your trash, consider adding kitty litter or some other type of oil absorbent prior to tossing it in your refuse cart.

LEAD-ACID BATTERIES & USED MOTOR OIL

If you have lead acid batteries (such as a car battery) or used motor oil to be disposed of, you can **call Waste Management and they will arrange to pick up those items from your curbside.** In addition, O'Reilly Auto Parts accepts



used motor oil and filters, along with other general automotive fluids (such as transmission and steering fluids).

SCRAP METAL

If you have scrap metal items to dispose of, **Yaeger Auto Salvage (8205 Camp Phillips Rd.) will accept scrap metal year-round.** Please refer to the Yaeger Auto Salvage insert on page 16 for more information, or call them at 715-359-3606.

SMALL KITCHEN APPLIANCES

With single-stream recycling, where plastics and metals are placed within the same cart, some people have asked if they can recycle their small kitchen appliances in their recycling cart. The answer is NO. The reason for this is when the recyclables are delivered to the MRF (Material Recovery Facility), all materials are separated by sorters (human, mechanical, and electronic). The sorters would have to physically take these appliances apart in order to separate them, which is not practical or feasible. For this reason, **small kitchen appliances should get disposed of in your trash cart.**



STYROFOAM

Styrofoam is the second most misplaced item we find in the recycling carts. The large white pieces of Styrofoam can be recycled, but not in our recycling carts. We recommend you take these to Styrene Products (see add on page 15). Styrene Products only accepts certain foam products during their office hours, Monday - Thursday, 6am - 2pm. See the article on page 15. Please know that the small pieces (like packaging peanuts and food containers) are not recyclable and should be sealed up in a plastic bag and thrown in the trash (unless you can reuse those for your own packaging needs).

SHARPS

Marathon County Solid Waste (172900 State HWY 29, Ringle) will accept used sharps, provided they are placed within a commercial sharps container (which can be found at most pharmacies) or placed in a heavy plastic detergent or bleach bottle with a screw-on cap. Do **NOT** use milk jugs or other thin plastic containers! You can also find a list of registered sharps collection locations by visiting the following Wisconsin DNR website: www.dnr.wi.gov/topic/waste/documents/faclists/sharpscollection.pdf.

AEROSOL CANS

Aerosol cans (even if empty) are not to go in the recycling bin. These are permitted to go within your refuse cart.

OUTDATED/UNWANTED PRESCRIPTION MEDICATION

Everest Metro Police Department (5303 Mesker St.) has a secure drop box in their lobby, where you can drop off your unwanted/outdated prescription medication—no questions asked. Leave the medication in its packaging; simply drop the packaged medication into the drop box. **Please note that needles and chemotherapy drugs are NOT accepted in this drop box.**

FLUORESCENT LIGHT BULBS

Because Compact Florescent Lamp (CFL) light bulbs contain mercury, they are considered hazardous waste. **A few places that accept CFL bulbs, but may charge a small fee, are Marathon County Solid Waste Department, Waste Management, and Batteries Plus Bulbs.** Focus on Energy provides a list of local participating retailers who will accept and recycle CFL bulbs. Please visit their website for details: www.focusonenergy.com.

HOUSEHOLD BATTERY DISPOSAL

Household / Alkaline Batteries (AAA, AA, C, D, 6V, 9V) are not hazardous and can be placed in the regular garbage; however, they can be recycled at certain locations to recover their materials, such as at the Marathon County Solid Waste Department and Batteries Plus Bulbs. We encourage you to call the locations in advance to learn what they accept and if there is a charge.

There are some types of batteries (such as button batteries, Ni-Cd, lead acid, silver oxide) that may be considered hazardous and need to be disposed of properly. These hazardous batteries can be brought to Marathon County Solid Waste Department's Household Hazardous Waste Facility. Please be aware that the ends of certain batteries may need to be covered with tape to reduce fire hazards. All batteries should be sorted by size & type, and stored in plastic bags. KEEPING PAPER & CARDBOARD OUT OF THE TRASH!

During our 2019 Summer and Fall Waste Audit Events, it was found that residents were continuing to place paper and cardboard materials in their refuse (instead of recycling) carts. We certainly understand that people may be concerned about privacy issues, and perhaps that's why these are ending up in the refuse carts. If privacy is a concern, please consider:

- **Shredding your paper**—Please place the shreds in a paper (NOT plastic) bag; do not dump loose shredded paper into your recycling cart. You can tape or staple the bag of shreds closed and either deliver your bag to Waste Management (recycling collection area) or place the taped/stapled bag in your recycling cart. If you have a friend with a farm, shredded paper makes for great animal bedding!
- **Reducing the amount of junk mail you receive**—There are several websites you can visit to opt out of receiving junk mail. Simply search “How to Stop Junk Mail” online to find many sites to choose from.

Please know that the employees at the recycling sorting facilities (known as Material Recovery Facilities, or MRFs) are moving through the materials at a high rate of speed and don't have time to read your junk mail.

Finally, do not bundle your paper or cardboard with any kind of ties or straps, as they will get tangled in the equipment used to manage recyclables. The best way to keep your paper or cardboard material contained is by placing them in paper (NOT plastic) bags before placing them in your recycling cart.

2023 CLEAN-UP EVENTS

YARD MATERIALS PICK-UP

SPRING & FALL

The Spring Yard Materials Pick-Up generally occurs beginning the second week of **May**, and the Fall Yard Materials Pick-Up generally occurs beginning the second week of **October**. Please watch our website or contact the Village of Weston office closer to that time period for updates. Yard materials can be taken directly to the Weston Yard Materials Site (8200 Ryan St.), where you can dispose of your yard materials at a time that is convenient to you. Please be aware that only Weston residents who pay the special Refuse & Recycling charge on their property tax bill are eligible to use the Weston Yard Materials Site. Accessibility (hours and those permitted) may be limited in the near future to reduce the amount of illegal dumping of garbage occurring on this property. If you're at the site and witness someone throwing garbage in the yard waste dumpsters or leaving garbage on the ground, please take note of their vehicle and license plate number and contact Everest Metro Police Department.

ELECTRONICS RECYCLING EVENT

SPRING

The Spring Electronics Recycling event is set to occur on **May 3** from 3:30 p.m. to 6:00 p.m. behind the Weston Municipal Center. The crew from [RecycleThatStuff.com](https://www.recyclethatstuff.com) will be here again to collect all your unwanted electronics, ranging from a small toaster to large TVs. Most small appliances will be free of charge, but some larger electronics (such as TVs) will require you to pay a small fee. An event flyer listing the prices for chargeable items will be available at www.westonwi.gov/Refuse-Recycling in March.

IMPORTANT REMINDERS

- To be guaranteed pick-up of your refuse and recycling, **you must have your carts placed out at the edge of your property by 6:00 a.m.** the morning of your refuse and recycling collection day.
- Refuse and recycling carts are to be removed from the right-of-way (curbside/boulevard area) within 12 hours of collection time.
- To prevent carts from being an obstruction to snowplows, **carts are prohibited from being placed within the roadway.** The Village will **NOT** be responsible for carts that are damaged due to being struck by Village snowplows.
- Carts should not be overfilled.** Overfilled carts can lead to your garbage and/or recyclables blowing out on windy days, or can lead to spills when the Waste Management driver is trying to empty it. The Waste Management drivers have the authority to choose not to empty a cart that is overflowing. Garbage stickers can be purchased at the Weston Municipal Center for \$1.50 each (per bag), if needed. Excess recycling can be taken to Waste Management's site during their office hours.
- Keep trash in the trash, and be sure to recycle appropriate materials.

SPRING COMMUNITY PAPER SHREDDING EVENT

MAY 10TH

As part of spring cleaning, it seems people find a lot of old papers that they want to dispose of, but are not comfortable disposing them in their recycling bin.

The Village of Weston is working with IROW to introduce a Spring Community Paper Shredding Event, to occur on Wednesday, May 10th, from 2pm – 6pm. Similar to our spring and fall bulk-item drop-off events, this event will only be available to properties who pay the \$167.00 refuse & recycling special charge on their property tax bill.

This paper shredding event will take place at the Weston Municipal Center. Watch our website and social media outlets for more information!

BULK-ITEM DROP-OFF

The annual Spring and Fall Bulk-Item Drop-Offs are set to occur **May 18-20** and **October 5-7** at Waste Management (5509 Fuller St.). Items that will be accepted include: **non-metal items, furniture, carpeting, scrap lumber, mattresses, and glass windows.** Proof of a Weston address will be required, and we may limit residents to 2 or 3 trips.

FREE “LEFTOVER” HOUSEHOLD SUPPLIES!

Need a little paint, some degreaser, or lawn fertilizer?

When people bring in their unwanted paint, cleaners, fertilizers, etc., the Marathon County Household Hazardous Waste facility will stock partially filled containers on their “Choose to Reuse” shelf to be given away FREE to people who have a need for them. When the shelf gets full, a picture and list of these free items are posted on Craigslist, and anyone can then take them home.

HOME COMPOSTING

Composting (“recycling”) your yard, garden, and kitchen waste is the easiest and cheapest way of taking responsibility for some of your own waste. Did you know that food and yard waste make up 25 – 30% of our solid wastes nationwide?

The BEST place to compost is in our own backyards! Composting meets the criteria of the three Rs: reduce, reuse, and recycle. Through composting, the amount of waste sent to the landfill is reduced, the organic matter is reused, and it is recycled into a useful soil additive.

If you’re interested in learning more about home composting and/or would like to purchase a compost bin, please contact Marathon County Solid Waste at 877-270-3989. Also, be sure to reference the Village of Weston’s Solid Waste Residential Composting ordinance (available at: www.westonwi.gov/RefuseRecycling-Guidelines) to ensure proper implementation and use (Chapter 66.121).

WHY RECYCLE SHINGLES? *Research has found that adding five (5) percent ground asphalt shingles to the hot-mix for paving and repairing roads improves its performance and makes it hold up better than a hot-mix without the ground-up shingles.*

2023 SPRING HOME COMPOST BIN SALES

Marathon County Solid Waste Department will be holding their annual Spring Home Compost Bin Sale, which typically runs March/April through the beginning of May. The Village of Weston participates in this event by being a “host” site where people who purchase compost bins during the sale can pick up their bins.

In 2022, the County received an overwhelming response from the bin sales, where they sold out their entire stock! This is an indicator that more people are showing an interest in home composting!

WASTE AUDITS

Due to COVID-19, our typical spring and fall waste audits has not occurred in the last few years. NEVER, EVER place the following in your recycling cart:

- Garbage
- Plastic bags or film
- Grease-soaked or soiled paper products
- Large plastic items (toys, pails, etc.)
- Batteries, light bulbs, or waste oil
- Household hazardous waste

ALWAYS:

- Check this *Refuse & Recycling Guide* for a list of items **REQUIRED** to be recycled in Weston.

IF IN DOUBT about an item:

- Call the Marathon County Solid Waste & Recycling Information Line: 877-270-3989, Waste Management: 715-359-6637, or the Village of Weston: 715-359-6114.

Please understand that under Wisconsin's 1990 solid waste reduction, recovery, and recycling law, people can be fined for improper disposal.

Recycling Cart REMINDERS

CART PLACEMENT

Please place your recycling cart on the opposite side of your driveway as your refuse (garbage) cart on pick-up day. If this is not possible, **please keep at least 4 feet of space in between the two carts** to allow enough room for the mechanical hand on Waste Management's truck to reach around the cart so it can be picked up and emptied without disturbing your other cart. **Please do NOT place carts in the roadway, as they will create a hazard to traffic and will be at risk of getting struck by a snowplow.** The Village of Weston will not be responsible for refuse and recycling carts damaged due to being struck by snowplows.

RECOMMENDED CART PLACEMENT



- Place carts on either side of the driveway (pictured here) or on the same side with at least 4 feet between carts.
- To prevent accidental mailbox damage, keep 4 feet between the cart and your mailbox.

Further examples of “how to” and “how not to” place your carts can be found on the Village of Weston’s website: www.westonwi.gov/Refuse-Recycling.

While we understand that you may face some challenges with the placement of your carts during the winter months, we ask that you consider the following ideas:

- Only place your refuse cart out on non-recycling weeks.
- Shovel an area of your snowbank to allow one (or both) of your carts to be located on the boulevard.

DID YOU KNOW...

You can bring clothing, like old, tattered, non-salable t-shirts, to Goodwill, where those shirts will be sent to their facility in Appleton and processed into rags? Next time you have a torn shirt and are thinking of throwing it in the trash, consider taking it to Goodwill!

Marathon County Solid Waste Department (a.k.a. Ringle Landfill), located at 172900 State Highway 29, in Ringle, is a great resource for people to consider if they have large amounts of trash or large bulky items to dispose of. The cost to dispose of material is very reasonable (as of 01/01/2023, for loads weighing less than 1,000 pounds, the cost is only \$35.00).

Also, if you have excess recyclables to dispose of, you can bring those there (for a small fee).
